- 5. What does Hebrews teach you, overall, about the need for the Old Testament to properly understand and appreciate the New Testament?
- 6. According to Hebrews 9:11-15, what benefits do we now enjoy because of what Christ has accomplished? What are practical examples of how these are manifested in everyday life?
