## Discussion Questions

1. (v. 1-6) Paul says that God has not rejected His people, Israel. What does Paul's example (himself) and the remnant chosen by grace teach us about God's faithfulness?
2. (v. 7-10) Paul talks about Israel being hardened. Why do you think God allowed this hardening? How do we reconcile this with His love and justice?
3. (v. 11-12) How does Israel's stumbling bring salvation to the Gentiles? What does Paul mean by saying this will provoke Israel to jealousy?
4. (v. 13-15) What do these verses reveal about Paul's sense of hope for Israel? How should this same hope affect the way we think about our loved ones who are not followers of Jesus?
5. (v. 16-18) What does the olive tree metaphor reveal about the relationship between Jews and Gentiles in God's plan? How should this affect our attitude toward others in the faith?
6. (v. 19-24) Paul warns the Gentile believers not to be arrogant. What lessons can we draw about humility, inclusion, and God's mercy from this passage?
