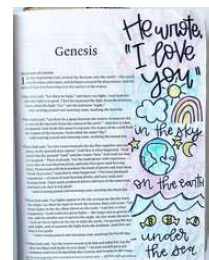

Apologetics 101 is our first foray into a serious defense of the faith. The fall semester focuses on scientific, evidential, and biblical apologetics. The class will empower students with the knowledge they need to defend their faith and stand firm on the truth both in times of trial and testing and when good times tempt them to be overly self-reliant. Students will also learn tactics for talking to others who are non-believers or may disagree with our positions in a winsome and empathetic way that still holds fast to truth.

*We will address topics such as creation and the Flood versus evolution, historical support for the truth of biblical accounts of Old and New Testament events, and the reliability of Scripture as it has been handed down to us from ancient days and translated. As we address these topics in a fun and engaging way, students' curiosity will be sparked to go even deeper in learning about apologetics on their own. A spring semester Apologetics 102 class will handle philosophical, theological, and religious & cult apologetics.

*The class will take a young earth creationist approach to the creation versus evolution debate, and while strong arguments will be made for that perspective, we will leave room for Christians to disagree. For older students, additional readings will be recommended to equip students more fully with knowledge on the topics discussed in class.
